





January 2023 Financial Update

Over the past year, we have seen All Saints' return to life as we have together enjoyed everything from weekly outreach, choral concerts, diocesan events, and parish events such as the beautiful service of Lessons and Carols in December complete with mulled wine and mincemeat tarts.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our 2022 stewardship campaign and to those who responded to our Christmas appeal. In December we received an additional \$20,000 in donations above what was budgeted. While our deficit was higher than budgeted, income (donations, grants, and rentals), for 2022 was \$18,000 higher than budgeted and we are encouraged to have seen a steady increase in income from 2021.

As we look to 2023, save the date of Sunday, February 19th for our annual general meeting where we will celebrate 2022 and pray and plan together for 2023. Below is a quick snapshot of our finances as of the end of 2022. A full financial report will be provided by our treasurer at our AGM.

Budget Snapshot as of Dec. 31st 2022

Income (Including Envelope Giving, Online Giving via Canada Helps, PAG and Rentals)

- Budgeted: \$351,300.00

- Actual: \$370,058.57

- *Income was \$18,758.57 higher than budgeted.*

Our parish has continued to be generous with giving and we have had an increase in building rentals.

Expenses

- Budgeted: \$482,104.20

- Actual: \$557,341.81

- *Expenses were \$75,237.61 above budget.*

Because of the costly property repairs from floods that we faced in January, the above budget expenses for the much-needed recarpeting project, and the expansion of the chapel window project from an artistic endeavor to one including needed, but expensive upgrades and renovations, our expenses were higher than budgeted. Our building continues to be a source of great blessing, but also a source of challenge as we look to keep it well-maintained.

Deficit

- Budgeted: -\$130,804.20

- Actual: -\$187,283.24

- *Deficit was \$56,479.04 higher than budgeted.*

Due to generous giving, an increase in rental income, cost-saving measures, and successful grant applications our higher-than-budgeted deficit was about \$19,000 lower than the extra expenses that we incurred throughout the year.
